- *AICE Diploma students must take 7 AICE classes AND pass the end of course exam for each of those classes.
- *AICE learners must achieve at least one credit from each of Groups 1 (Math & Science), Group 2 (Languages) and Group 3 (Arts & Humanities). A maximum of two credits can count from Group 4 (Interdisciplinary subjects), which is optional.
- *AICE Global Perspectives & Thinking Skills are required courses.
- *AICE Diploma students will have 14 AICE course options to choose from at MSA.
- *AICE students also have the flexibility to take AP and Dual Enrollment courses, but will not count towards the AICE Diploma.
- *No Pert score required for AICE. Minimum 2.75 GPA required. 3 or higher on latest standardized assessments. Application must be completed, submitted, and approved.
- *AICE students the option to finish by their Junior year.
- *AICE students will meet with the AICE Coordinator on a consistent basis to review progression and progress.
- *This is a preferred progression plan. Students have flexibility to take different courses based on needs and interests.
